



What Problem Does This Solve?


Wrapping tape/rope around cones maybe awkward, wasteful and difficult to secure. A retractable belt barrier can quickly be deployed, adapted or removed with no issues.




Knowledge Share

Consider a trial use of 'belt barriers' instead of rope or caution tape when cordoning off safe zones (e.g. beneath the basket when hoist is in use).



 **Success Factors** The 'belt barrier' is spring-loaded, it creates flexible barriers and fits on top of traffic cones. It is neater and more user-friendly.
